LUAUS

A luau is a traditional Hawaiian party containing a feast of popular Hawaiian dishes, traditional music and hula. It originated in 1819 when King Kamehameha broke tradition that prohibited men and women from dining together and had a feast for men and women alike. The name "luau" is in reference to the taro leaves that make an appearance in a favorite traditional meal: the leaves of the taro plant are combined with chicken and baked in coconut milk to produce the "luau." The luau became a massive event, the largest being King Kalakaua's, "the merry monarch", 1500 person birthday luau in 1847. The luau gained popularity internationally during the 1930s-1950s when tourism to Hawaii boomed. Hula girls with ukuleles became an icon of Hawaiian culture and people visited from far and wide to experience such a lavish party. Modern luaus display not only Hawaiian rituals but connections with other Polynesian cultures. Luaus are one of the most festive ways to experience a taste of Hawaiian history in a culturally connected world. More information on local luaus can be found here.
